A Word From Our President



I have frequently marveled that taking photos on one's smartphone seems to be the most popular method for many, many people today. My digital camera is on the shelf somewhere and I take almost all of my pictures now using my phone. The phone is always with me and convenient to pick up and use. The pixels and resolution of my 3 year old phone pictures are better than my five year old digital camera.

You can take that great spontaneous picture that you can then easily share with family and friends and record your memories as they happen.

I have mentioned before that I used the groovebook.app (groovebook.com) to print 100 of my pictures per month. I actually share this account with my daughter and we both upload pictures to the service. I am billed \$3 plus tax monthly (shipping is included in that price) and receive a photo album of 100 4x6 nicely printed pictures. I can order more copies for the same price if I choose. You can't beat that ability and it works hand-in-hand with the great options available to the photographer on his phone.

Another feature I have been appreciating is the ability to immediately upload any photos I take on my smartphone to the "cloud" for a backup option and a convenience. Several cloud services allow you to do this for a nominal fee. Currently I use Amazon Cloud photos. As an Amazon Prime Subscriber it is one of the services I have access to. I take a picture on the phone and it is immediately backed up to the cloud. Since they are then in the cloud, I can limit which photos I carry around on my phone, freeing up space there. I also have the convenience of accessing them easily from anywhere, including my home computer, so I can edit or share them in any fashion I want

So keep in mind that Amazon Cloud Drive Photos lets you back up the photos and videos on your phone or tablet in Amazon Cloud Drive, secure cloud storage that you can access on any computer or device. This free cloud storage app makes photo backup simple so your pictures are safe, even if your Android is lost, damaged, or upgraded. This is a free service for Amazon Prime members and a \$5 a year special introductory price is available now for everyone.

Richard announced we have a new sponsor: EMPIRICAL COMPUTERS on Lake Ave., Elyria. They perform computer repair in Lorain County.


Carole has reserved shelter #1 at Lakeview Park for Sunday, July 17, 2016.

Witches in Your Family Tree

This is the time of year for ghosts, goblins, and other such superstitions. However, perhaps it is also a time to pause and reflect on the horrors of those who suffered in Salem, Massachusetts, in 1692. The witches of Salem and nearby towns probably have hundreds of thousands of present-day descendants. If you have ancestry from early Essex County, Massachusetts, you have an excellent chance of finding a connection

to the Salem Witch Trials of 1692.

ty were amongst the first settled in this country.

Most of the towns were established prior to 1640. By the time of the witchcraft trials of 1692, a complete legal system of courts and clerks was well established. Records were written, and many of them have been preserved. Even if your ancestors are not among those accused, it is quite possible that you can find them mentioned as witnesses, those who gave depositions, or perhaps even those who served on a jury.

The reasons for the witchcraft hysteria have been debated for centuries. One modern theory involves ergot of rye, a plant disease that is caused by a fungus, Claviceps purpurea. Anyone who eats bread made with ergot-infected rye can exhibit symptoms of muscle spasms, tremors, and writhing. This may be accompanied by hallucinations. Such afflictions can indicate poisoning by ergot, or "ergotism." Modern science has documented likely cases of ergotism in the Dark Ages, but the cause was only proposed in 1670 by a French physician, and outbreaks in the 20th century have shed much more light on both symptoms and their cause.

We know much about the lives of the Puritan inhabitants of Essex County in 1692. We know that they were mostly illiterate, and almost all citizens were intensely religious. In their simple lives, they were afraid of the darkness and of many things in this world that they did not understand. They were

convinced that the Devil walked amongst them every night and that he had many disciples. This fear was reinforced by the sermons delivered by Reverend Samuel Parris most every Sunday. If the citizens of Salem and nearby towns did exhibit muscle spasms, tremors, writhing and hallucinations, one cannot be surprised that their neighbors felt the victims were indeed possessed by the Devil himself.

Ergot of Rye occurs in hot, humid weather. Warm, rainy springs and summers promote heavier than usual fungus infestation of rye. The pattern of the weather in 1691 and 1692 is apparent from brief comments in the diary of Samuel Sewall of Salem. Early rains and warm weather in the spring progressed to a hot and stormy summer in 1691, perfect conditions for creating hallucinogenic bread in the fall and winter of 1691, well into the spring and possibly very early summer of 1692, before the new crop of rye was harvested. Sewall recorded that there was a drought in 1692; thus, no contamination of the grain would be expected that year.

You can read a detailed explanation of ergotism and the possibilities of its occurrence in Salem in an article by Linnda R. Caporael at http://www.physics.smu.edu/scalise/P3333fa07/Ulcers/ergotism.html. There is no proof available today that ergot of rye was the cause of the Salem Witch Trials. It does, however, provide an intriguing possibility.

The whole series of episodes began in December 1691 and into January, a time when the people of Salem would be eating bread made from the summer's rye harvest, rye that had time to become infected with ergot. Two girls - Betty Parris, daughter of minister Samuel Parris, and his niece Abigail Williams - began exhibiting strange behavior. Soon a number of other young girls were also exhibiting the same symptoms. Several historians have suggested that perhaps the girls were simply playing childish games.

Physicians called in to examine the girls could find no explanation for their illness. In February one doctor suggested the girls might be bewitched. A neighbor had Parris's Barbados slave, Tituba, concoct a "witch cake" in order to determine if witchcraft was present. Shortly thereafter, the girls made an accusation of witchcraft against Tituba and two elderly women of general ill repute in Salem Village, Sarah Good and Sarah Osborn. The three women were taken into custody on 29 February 1692. The afflictions of the girls did not cease, and in March they accused Martha Corey and Rebecca Nurse. Both of these women were well respected in the village and were covenanting members of the church. Further accusations by the children followed. By June the hunt for "witches" expanded beyond Salem to Andover, Ipswich, Gloucester, and other nearby towns.

The accused witches were tried and most of them found guilty, using logic that sounds silly today. However, to the illeducated citizens of Salem, these were "facts." Contrary to some stories, none of the witches of Salem were ever burned at the stake. With one exception, all were hanged at a public gallows. The one exception is poor Giles Cory, a church-

going member of the community, who was pressed to death with large stones.

The last hangings occurred in September of 1692, and by May of 1693 all accused witches still imprisoned were released. It is interesting to note that the reported drought of 1692 would have meant the elimination of ergot of rye by September, the time of the last execution

The final count of witchcraft victims was twenty executed and more than a hundred

imprisoned. (One died in prison.) In addition, many others fled into exile or hiding places, their homes were broken up, their estates were ruined, and their families were left in desolation. All of this was caused by the leaders in the communities: the magistrates and ministers.

Finding your ancestors' roles during the Salem Witch Trials may not be terribly difficult. Many of the original trial documents are now both in print and online. You might start at some of these:

Bogus Loan Default Agency Threatens Jail

If you borrow money for any purpose, there's hardly anything scarier than receiving an arrest warrant claiming you defaulted on the loan.

That's the kind of fear factor that crooks often count on in trying to convince victims into clicking a link or attachment that will install malware onto their PCs.

In its latest guise, scammers kick this trick up a notch by claiming their communication is from a government department called the Bureau of Defaulters — which actually doesn't exist.

They send emails to victims warning that not only are they behind with payments on a loan — which they usually don't specify — but they've also failed to respond to previous attempts to contact them.

Hence the phony arrest warrant attached to the message, plus a further warning that the victim's Social Security number is being "held," whatever that means. Since most of us have some type of loan — mortgages, car loans, credit card balances or other kinds of debt — it's not surprising that many victims fall for this threat.

Just to add to the pressure, the email warns victims they have just 24 hours to respond to the message — or else.

But downloading the supposed arrest warrant is really just another sly way to get you to install the scammers' malware, which is set up to steal passwords and other confidential information from host PCs.

If you get an email like this, trash it, secure in the knowledge that there's no Bureau of Defaulters and that government agencies don't send out threatening emails like this. In fact, they don't use emails at all to initiate contact.

Vets in Their Sights

A second dubious loan-related practice specifically targets military veterans.

On at least five occasions recently, the Consumer Finance Protection Bureau (CFPB) has sent out enforcement notices to companies that seem to be spamming vets with mortgage offers.

In the latest incident, the CFPB reports that a company sent out ads to veterans and other eligible borrowers bearing the logo of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), thereby misleading recipients into thinking the offer was endorsed by the VA.

The ads apparently also misrepresented the terms and costs of the mortgages being offered.

Other important terms were either omitted or hidden in the small print, while mailing envelopes were, in the words of the CFPB, "plastered with warnings about 'fines or imprisonment' under U.S. law."

If you're a vet or VA-eligible, note that the VA does not send out solicitations for its loan programs and it doesn't endorse any particular lender.

Realtors Tricked into Giving Away Client Details

Staying on the property theme, watch out for a new scam attack that builds on a trick we reported recently in which homebuyers are conned into sending money to a phony escrow or title service.

We previously reported how buyers receive an email seemingly from their Realtor asking them to wire money to this "escrow" or title service ahead of closing a deal. But how do the scammers get hold of agents' client details in the first place?

They hack the Realtors' computers by posing as other agents with potential buyers for a property they have listed.

The scammers email agents with this enticing prospect and a link that, once again, downloads malware onto their PCs, from where it steals their client information. So, if you're a Realtor, beware of this trick — don't click links promising to deliver a buyer (and keep your security software up to date).

And if you're a buyer, phone your agent to confirm any request you receive asking you to wire money to anyone.

New Twist in Grandparent Scam

Now, we have news of an alarming new twist in the well-known imposter or grandparent scam.

It goes beyond the conventional format in which the victim receives a call from a supposed relative in trouble, asking for money to be wired to them.

In this new version, the phony relative says he will send a friend around to the victim's home to collect the cash. Then the scammer actually turns up on the victim's doorstep, posing as the friend and demands the money or even insists he takes them to the bank to collect the (Continued on page 9)

cash.

This trick not only gets the money into the hands of the crooks much faster but also avoids the need to wire the cash, a ruse the money transfer firms are increasingly alerting victims about when they try to make the payment.

Although we have no evidence of it yet, it's also possible that a scammer could turn up on your doorstep without even making a prior phone call and ask for the money to help a relative.

Either way, it's imperative to shut the door on these crooks without handing over a cent.

When you think of it, these stories just don't ring true. But if you worry they might be, then phone the real person or someone who knows them and find out for real whether they're in trouble.

Alert of the Week

Security software firm Malwarebytes is itself being targeted by scammers who set up a Twitter account partly using its name.

The scammers then tweet messages to followers warning about viruses and providing a supposed support phone number.

It's a variation on the well-known tech support scam. Once a victim calls the number, they're asked to grant a phony specialist access to their PC so the crooks can steal information.

Can I restore an image backup of one computer onto another and have it work?

The concept seems simple: take a system image of one machine, restore it to another, and avoid lengthy setup time. Unfortunately, it's not that simple.

If I want to restore an image backup from a previous computer, complete with its operating system, onto another computer with a different operating system, will the operating system on the backup be allowed to install and override the operating system on the other computer? If so, how do I get around this?

It's not a question of "allowing".

By definition, restoring a full image backup will completely overwrite everything that exists on the hard disk, replacing whatever was there before, no matter what it was.

So, sure, the previous operating system, along with everything else on the hard disk, will be overwritten and replaced with the contents of the image backup.

The real question is: will what you've just restored then work?

Most of time, the answer is a very short "no".

I'll explain why that is.

What your backup is and isn't for What you're asking is an extremely common question – so common that I discuss it in each of my "Saved!" series of books on backing up.

Since an image backup contains the entire system, many people would like to use it when moving to a completely new machine. The concept is simple: restore that image backup to a new or replacement machine, and carry on where you left off

That's *not* what image backups are for.

Image backups are a snapshot of a specific machine, and are designed to be used in either of two scenarios:

- •Restoration of the entire system to a known good state *on the same machine* for instance, in case of malware infestation.
- •Restoration of the entire system to a replacement hard drive *on the same machine*, as in the case of a hard-drive failure.

Because image backups contain everything on the machine, they are also very conveniently used for one additional pur-

pose:

•Restoration of *specific* files, typically data files, onto any machine, anywhere, at any time (even the files you didn't know you needed), because the backup contains *everything*.



Restoring a complete image backup to *different* hardware isn't on the list.

Windows configures itself for your ma-

chine

When you install an operating system, the set-up program goes through what appears to be pretty much the same sequence on every machine: you enter the product key, type in a little information, tell it what machine name you want and perhaps the time zone, and pick an administrator password. Then, set up goes to work, showing a progress bar or some propaganda information about the benefits of the operating system you're installing and how wonderful your life together will be.

What happens behind the scenes is *significantly* more complex.

Every machine is different from every other machine, and it's during installation that those differences are accommodated. Once it's set up, Windows is highly customized to the specific characteristics of your specific computer.

What your backup image contains

The problem is that a backup image of any machine contains a version of Windows *specifically configured* for the computer on which the backup was taken.

It has drivers and settings for that hardware, and has generally been customized *for that hardware*. Attempting to restore Windows to a different machine means it won't have the proper configuration it needs to run. Depending on just how different the hardware turns out to be, you may experience any of the following:

- •Windows won't even boot. This is fairly common.
- •Windows may "run", but will be unstable or present an assortment of error messages.
- •Windows may appear to run, but at some point later you may discover instability or other problems that defy explanation.

I suppose in some cases, it could just work... but it's not something you should count on.

Restoring to a different machine might work if....

It is possible for the scenario to work, but several conditions must be met.

•The motherboard on the two machines must be similar. What does "similar" mean? There's no real definition:

motherboards often have a variety of hardware that require a specific set of drivers in order to work properly. Ideally, the motherboards would be identical.

- •For individual devices that are not identical, they, too, must be "similar". Once again, the degree of similarity depends on the specific device and the capabilities of the driver installed.
- •For those individual devices that are not even similar, then they must be optional, meaning that the system will run properly without the device.

If those conditions are met, maybe it'll work.

And it's a *huge* if.

It's possible that Windows will be able to boot, notice that some non-critical hardware has "changed", go through the process of updating itself (perhaps asking for driver or installation disks), and actually run.

What you're suggesting is actually a very common approach to installations that have a large number of *identical* machines, but the further you stray from truly identical machines, the lower your chances are of this approach working.

Windows on a new machine

When replacing a machine, the more correct sequence is:

- 1. Install Windows from scratch if it didn't come with the machine to begin with.
- 2. Install your applications from scratch.
- 3. Restore your data files from your backups.
- 4. Make a backup image so you don't have to repeat steps 1 through 3 again should you ever need to restore *this* machine to its initial condition.

If, on the other hand, the failure does *not* involve replacing your entire machine, then the process is much simpler:

1. Restore the entire machine from your image backup. Because that's exactly what a backup is for.

There are tools...

Before we give up on the concept entirely, I do want to point out that there are tools that can sometimes help in situations where an install from scratch is something you really want to avoid.

Redeploy is a feature available in some versions of my recommended backup program, <u>Macrium Reflect</u>, that specifically attempts to restore an image configured for one machine to another. I've used this once or twice successfully to move a backup image of a friend's computer onto a virtual machine (another case of completely different hardware). Other companies, particularly those with backup programs, have additional solutions to address this scenario.





My Windows 10 Upgrade Experiences

I've been previewing Windows 10 since October of 2014 and really like it. The official release couldn't come fast enough for me!

I'm been fortunate enough to have a great laptop to run the preview on...i7 processor, 8 gigs of memory, with a touch-enabled 12" screen. I'm also fortunate enough to have had a spare hard drive to install the preview on. Along the way this disk was replaced by an OCZ SSD disk with Windows 10 migrated using Macrium Reflect, Fast and responsive machine.

As I was running build 10240, July 29th came and went. My preview machine didn't see anything, other than the patches/ updates released shortly after. Microsoft gave me a copy of Windows 10 for being part of the preview. Kool!!!! The real fun came with my other machines.

The other machines ran a mix of Windows 8 Pro, Windows 7 Home Premium and Windows 7 Ultimate. Talk about a disaster waiting to happen...

Being a somewhat impatient person, I found that if you went to https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/software-download/windows10, you could grab the appropriate (32- or 64-bit based) downloader and updates rather than wait for Microsoft

to download them. I grabbed an upgrade to Windows 10 Pro 64-bit and Windows 10 Home 32-bit. Yep, that's the other kicker...versions based on differing hardware architecture. Yes, I had to totally download the update for both. They are 3 -4 gigs in size, so be prepared to wait a while. After the first downloaded I copied the appropriate folders (\$Windows.~BT and \$Windows.~WS) from the root of C: to another location...otherwise they would be overwritten by the next download. I also deleted these directory contents after downloading the first files to be sure I had only the proper files for the 2nd download.

I decided to take it easy...the first upgrade was to a laptop running Windows 8.1 Pro 64 bit. This had plenty of free space on the C drive and this hard drive was setup up to the Microsoft standards of dedicated boot and system drive.

I first uninstalled the software I no longer used...know why? Well it just seemed like the proper thing to do. Most were older versions of utility suites that i got from share-wareonsale.com.

Since I like to try various antivirus products, I removed the antivirus product before running the update. Also because the Google Chrome browser simply did not run properly on the preview of Windows 10, I removed it. I copied the folders listed above to the C:\ drive of the hard drive of interest then ran setupdat.exe from:

\$Windows.~WS\source\Windows\source and away we go.

After a few hours and a few reboots, the process completed successfully. I logged in with my preview ID and the update activated, ran the update tools to grab the latest updates, installed my anti-virus program and Firefox and it was done. All in all, relatively smooth.

Basking in the glory of a successful update, I turned my attention to my Dell Venue 8 Pro tablet. The tablet was running a 32-bit version of Windows 8.1 with the drive protected by Bitlocker drive encryption. It had about 6 gigs free.

Before running the cleanup as above, including removing antivirus, I cleaned up everything I could; 6 gigs was below the stated minimum of 16 gigs free storage. I did check online and found that various folks reported the update process would ask for other storage to use during the update if the update process found additional free space was required. Let's remember this is a tablet lacking a mouse and keyboard and with marginal free storage. Still I pressed on and ran the update.

The update ran through the various stages for a couple of hours. Just when I thought it was successful, I saw the restoring the previous version message and the tablet proceeded to roll back the install. After another 40 minutes of roll back, the tablet booted into Windows 8,1 and displayed an error message of "0x80070002-0x20007 failed in the SAFE_OS phase with an error during INSTALL_DRIVERS operation|.Boot

failed ". Researching this error online was of no help. Lots had the solution, but none met my circumstances. SO what the heck, I tried the update again.

The second update try also failed. I was thinking I might have to perform a clean install or forget about running Windows 10 on this device. Performing a clean install was trouble-some...without an OS update would I get a valid Windows 10 product key for free? I had the install media for Windows 8, so I had the required media in case a reinstall was required.

However, as I had reinstalled Windows 8 on this tablet once before, I was not looking forward to it. Having to attach a mouse and keyboard to the tablet and manually unlocking the Bitlocker protected drive is doable, but a royal pain in the tush!

Then I got lucky. One of the devices I purchased along the way was a USB to DVI display adapter from mygica.com. I had tried using this with my Windows 10 preview laptop and discovered the included drivers did not work. A quick search of the Internet turned up some updated drivers. These worked fine in the preview Windows 10 version. I stumbled across the fact that I had used this device on my tablet. Perhaps????

Uninstalling the offending drivers from the tablet I was ready to try again. I was more than a little worried because the tablet now had less than 5 gigs. Try as I might, I couldn't find anything else to remove or purge. "On through the valley of ..." ...well you get the idea. I tried the update again, mentally preparing myself for a full Windows 8 reinstall.

Low and behold, it worked! The update finished successfully, the tablet booted and I logged in using the touch interface with my preview ID to a fully activated Windows 10! Beautiful!!!!

As before, I installed antivirus (a different one than before...remember I like to try different antivirus products) and Firefox, sync'd Firefox and I was up and running. On to my final challenge.

The final challenge is a desktop running Windows 7 Ultimate 64-bit with lots of installed software -- this unit was trouble-some. It simply hadn't been running well for a while and I had put off doing anything about it because I knew Windows 10 was coming.

First, I performed a full backup. Then I tried to make a virtual drive using Paragon's Virtual Drive tool. This failed due to conflicts with the Visual C++ runtime library. Try as I might, I could not fix this issue, so the heck with it. I performed the cleanup as above, but forgot about Google Chrome (more a little later). I'd been toying with the idea of installing a 240-GB SSD as the boot drive, so I cleaned up the hard drive even though it had over 100 gigs of free space. How? Well I moved OneDrive, Dropbox, Downloads, iTunes and some

others to other drives in the system. On to the update.

Yes, the update failed. Actually the desktop appeared to hang a couple of times so I did a forced reboot using the power off after letting the computer sit for at least an hour with nothing appearing to happen and no hard drive activity. Windows 10 update rolled back to Windows 7 with an error of "0xC1900101-0x40017 Installation failed in the SEC-OND BOOT phase with an error during BOOT operation"

Since I forcibly power cycled the computer not once, but twice, I figured I knew what happened...I didn't give it enough time. The next evening, I repeated the update letting it sit for houserrs at each pause. Had to power cycle it again. With the same result. Darn!

More deleting of software. This time I remembered Google Chrome and removed it. I also turned off the Wi-Fi adapter to prevent the unit from connecting to the internet (some on the Internet suggested this). Off to the update again. I had to power cycle once this time, but the update succeeded..at least I thought so because I was able to sign in to a non-activated machine. It was late. Time to power off and perform the cleanup tomorrow.

Tomorrow came. On came the desktop. And it just wasn't right. The mouse and keyboard were sticking. Video resolution was low. It looked like the proper video card had not been detected. And on and on. I decided to return to the previous OS. Which failed reporting no OS on the drive.

I have to tell you that the drive in question did not fit Microsoft's standards in that is no boot partition. The boot partition is that 300 megish partition that Microsoft started installing separate from the system partition that actually has the operating system. I've not been a fan of the boot partition and on this machine simply removed it.

Now is where it gets fuzzy. Somehow during one of the attempts at booting with no OS drive, I was presented with an option to perform a full install of Windows 10. Exactly how I don't recall. Might as well I said...off I went.

After confirming to preserve the user files and that I would lose all the installed applications, the reinstall started. And went fine till the 1st reboot. After letting it sit for almost 2 hours, I power cycled the unit, expecting it to lock up again, with another power cycle and then what? Reinstall Windows 7 Ultimate from scratch, then perform a Windows 10 update? Not a clue.

The 2nd power cycle never was required. Following the first power cycle, the install of Windows 10 continued and completed successfully. The install preserved the account I was using, so logging on I went.

To discover the computer was not activated, the proper video card had not been detected and Wi-Fi refused to work. Ready (Continued on page 15)

to pull my hair out (not a good thing, trust me!) I rebooted and signed on again using the local account. Then I connected the local account to the preview account, connected the Wi-Fi and rebooted.

Logged back in and Windows 10 was activated. Ok, why? Well I had been using the local user that I had created to log onto the computer. This time I used my preview ID. That has to be the key. I downloaded the updates and got the update for the video card. Apparently the AMD card in the unit is not supported by the install, but an update. Hey, at least it worked! I'm left to install antivirus and deciding what applications are critical and must be installed. I'm not unhappy about the results as I figured it was time to perform a clean OS install and reinstall applications. 6 of one, half-dozen of the other.

UPDATE! I'm adding this a few days after the original article was written. The updated Windows 7 Ultimate machine simply wasn't right. While it seemed to run, it was troublesome. I finally decided to reinstall from scratch again, this time preserving NOTHING.

Just in case, I booted from a rescue CD and copied the C drive to another drive then started the reinstall.

Windows 10 has a decent reinstall process. Go to Settings, Update, click Recovery and answer the questions. My answers were to reinstall, preserve nothing, and reformat the C drive. Away we go.

Things looked good. I gave it all the time it wanted. Ok, after waiting 5 hours for the process to finish, I power cycled the unit. It restarted at the 64% mark and finished successful.

Because I left the Internet connected, the update connected to the Internet and grabbed "critical" updates during the final install phase. For this reason, the proper video drivers were already installed when I signed into the system after install.

I preceded to install required applications, antivirus, Quicken, Office and am using the updated Windows 7 Ultimate machine to finish this article. So far so good!

So what did I learn?

- 1.Prepare for the worst...you might lose the applications and associated data. Determine what are critical apps and find the install media BEFORE the installation.
- 2. Copy your documents to the cloud or other storage.
- 3. Uninstall antivirus (NOT disabled), before the upgrade



it's still there on your PC. Just type it in your search box. The result will look like this.





dxdiag

DxDiag is a commonly requested file when dealing with tech problems. It contains information about the hardware your computer has and all sorts of other helpful information. This file does not contain *any sort* of personal information. How to obtain your DxDiag file: From the desktop click: Start > Run (or windows key + r). In the blank text field of the window that appears type "dxdiag" without the quotes. Press run or hit enter.

Another window should appear titled DirectX Diagnostic Tool. Near the bottom of the window click on "Save All Information..." A popup should appear with a progress bar, this may take a few minutes.

After it completes a dialog should appear asking you where to save the file. Recommended: save it to your desktop (automatically selected) with the default name and file type.

The startup impact column highlights programs that have a high impact on the system's startup which can be useful in determining whether you should disable the autostart of a program listed there. Use Ctrl-Shift-Esc to open the Task Manager. It is alternatively possible to right-click on the taskbar and select Task Manager from the context menu that opens up.

Switch to the Startup tab once the Task Manager has loaded. There you find listed the startup impact column. You can sort it with a click on the column header.
